Letter from the Board Chair

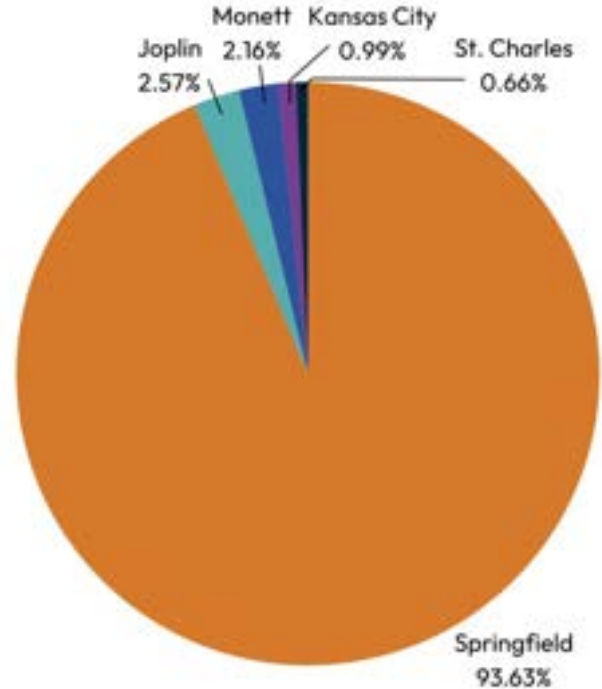

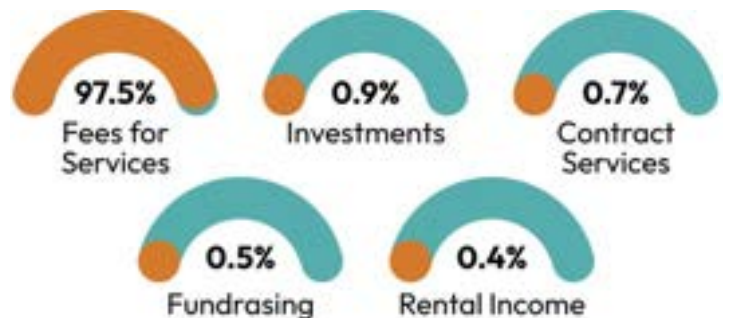


INDIVIDUALS RECEIVING SERVICES IN EACH DIVISION

Expanding The Arc of the Ozarks' Impact in 2025

The year 2025 marked an exciting chapter of growth and expansion for The Arc of the Ozarks. Guided by our mission to support individuals with disabilities and their families, we broadened our reach, strengthened services, and welcomed new leadership with the goal of meeting people where they are and helping them thrive in their communities.

A significant milestone of 2025 was the launch of Cornerstone Behavioral Services in St. Charles County. This expansion represents The Arc's continued commitment to providing high-quality, evidence-based behavioral supports.

At Cornerstone Behavioral Services, our therapeutic model focuses on teaching safe, positive alternatives to unwanted or high-risk behaviors. Using proven practices grounded in positive reinforcement and proactive interventions, our teams work to reduce challenging behaviors by promoting meaningful replacement skills. This approach is designed to create lasting, positive change not only for individuals, but also for families and communities.

In 2025, The Arc also entered into an exciting new partnership with Dynamic Strides Therapy (DST), an outpatient pediatric therapy clinic serving children from birth through age 21 in Southwest Missouri.



Dynamic Strides is a truly unique place where children with disabilities can experience the therapeutic benefits of equine movement, a specialized sensory gym, and the compassionate support of skilled, certified therapists. With innovative treatment facilities and a personalized, proactive approach, DST meets each child's individual needs while fostering growth, confidence, and independence.

As our services and geographic footprint continue to grow, strong leadership remains essential. In this past year, we were proud to welcome four new Regional Directors who have guided teams, supported staff, and ensured consistent, high-quality services across their communities.

Building Community Connections: Bringing People Together

The Arc of the Ozarks deepened its commitment to building strong, inclusive communities by creating opportunities for connection, education, and celebration. Through engaging events and meaningful conversations, we brought individuals, families, professionals, and community partners together to learn, connect, and grow.

Throughout the year, The Arc hosted several community-wide events designed to raise awareness, promote safety, and celebrate individuals of all abilities.

The ADA Block Party brought the community together to celebrate the Americans with Disabilities Act and the progress made toward accessibility and inclusion. Families, self-advocates, service providers, and community partners gathered for a day of connection, resources, and fun, reinforcing the importance of accessible and inclusive spaces for all.

Our Autism Blast was another highlight of 2025, offering a welcoming and sensory-friendly environment for individuals with autism and their families. The event combined education, activities, and community resources, creating a space where families could connect with one another while learning more about available supports and services.

In addition, The Arc hosted its first Safety Fair, a proactive initiative focused on empowering individuals with disabilities and their families with essential safety knowledge. Community partners, first responders, and service providers came together to share resources, demonstrate safety strategies, and foster confidence and preparedness in everyday situations.

A major milestone and honor was hosting Dr. Temple Grandin for a community forum. A globally respected advocate, author, and speaker, Dr. Grandin's visit sparked meaningful dialogue around autism, inclusion, and understanding neurodiversity. The forum provided an opportunity for families, professionals, educators, and self-advocates to hear directly from one of the most influential voices in autism advocacy. Her insights encouraged greater empathy, awareness, and practical understanding while strengthening the community's ability to support individuals on the autism spectrum.

Assistive Technology at The Arc of the Ozarks: Looking Back at 2025 and Ahead to 2026

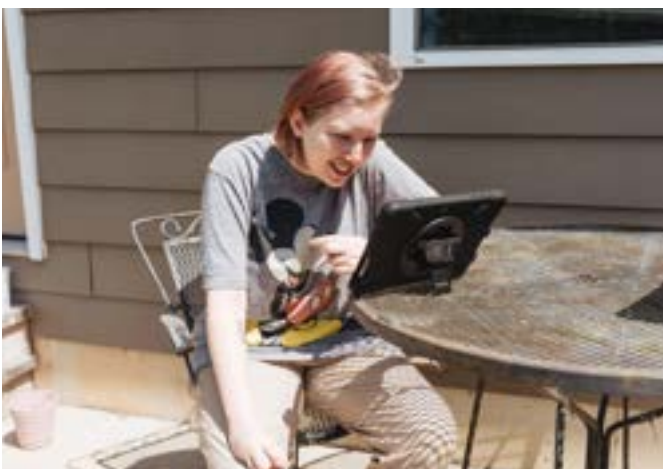
The Arc of the Ozarks is committed to expanding access to Assistive Technology (AT) and helping people learn how technology can support independence, safety, and quality of life. Assistive technology includes any item, equipment, software, or product system used to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of persons with disabilities.

We took important steps toward this goal through community education, events, and innovative support services. In March, we hosted our first Assistive Technology event open to the community at our Autism and Neurodevelopmental Center. The event brought together vendors and experts from nine organizations that provide adaptive equipment and assistive technology, giving attendees the opportunity to explore technology in person, connect with local providers, and ask questions directly to professionals.

Building on this momentum, The Arc of the Ozarks continues to expand the use of assistive technology through programs like Remote Supports. Through Missouri's Developmental Disability waivers, Remote Supports utilizes tools such as home sensors, telephones, two-way video communication, and monitors that track movement and health. These technologies allow staff to respond quickly when assistance is needed, while still respecting each individual's independence.

Amanda Fronzaglia, Director of Remote Support Services at HEARO, shared, "By combining HEARO's innovative technology with The Arc of the Ozarks' decades of experience, we are able to provide services that are as unique as the people we support."

Looking ahead, we are excited to expand our community outreach in 2026 with an Assistive Technology Showcase hosted at the Library Center. More details will be shared in the coming months.

Our multi-week program supports each camper's educational and recreational interests while giving them opportunities to try new activities, build confidence, and make lasting friendships.

Launching The Arc's Volunteer Program

In 2025, The Arc of the Ozarks expanded community involvement by launching a new, structured volunteer program designed to create meaningful opportunities for service and strengthen connections between the community and the individuals and families we support.

As the program continues to grow, The Arc looks forward to expanding volunteer opportunities across our communities. Together with our volunteers, we are building inclusive connections and strengthening our collective impact.



Meet Ellie

The Arc of the Ozarks Autism and Neurodevelopmental Center provided diagnostic evaluations for more than 400 individuals across southwest Missouri. While many of those evaluated were boys, the Center is seeing an increasing number of young girls referred for autism evaluations. As awareness grows, it is better understood that girls with autism spectrum disorder often present differently than boys and are typically diagnosed two to three years later.

One of those individuals was Ellie.

Ellie is known by her family as bright, funny, and confident—someone whose smile can light up a room. While her family noticed that certain tasks were more challenging for her and that she approached things differently than her siblings, they sought answers through a comprehensive evaluation at the Center.

Ellie, her mother Kalia, and her grandmother met with the diagnostic team, where a trusting relationship was quickly established.

Following the evaluation, Ellie’s family expressed gratitude for the seamless support they received—from the administrative team to the feedback session with Dr. Lindsey and Jamie, the Autism Resource Specialist. “The evaluation process was timely and extremely thorough,” shared Kalia. “From start to finish, we felt supported every step of the way.”

With a diagnosis and access to community resources, Ellie has continued to grow and thrive. She recently earned a perfect reading grade at school and has shown meaningful progress in confidence, communication, and independence. Her family and teachers have observed increased self-advocacy, social engagement, and willingness to take on new challenges.

Ellie’s grandmother reflected on the experience: “During the process, it finally clicked why Ellie does things the way she does. She was included every step of the way and never made to feel like an outsider. She knows she’s different - and she knows that’s okay.”

Ellie’s story reflects the impact of early evaluation, individualized support, and a community committed to helping every child reach their full potential.

Our work was also recognized through a Nonprofit Excellence Awards nomination in the Large Organization category, highlighting the strength of our mission and the collaborative spirit of the Ozarks' nonprofit community.

In addition, The Arc of the Ozarks was named a 2025 Health Care Champion – Health Care Large Organization, underscoring a core truth of our



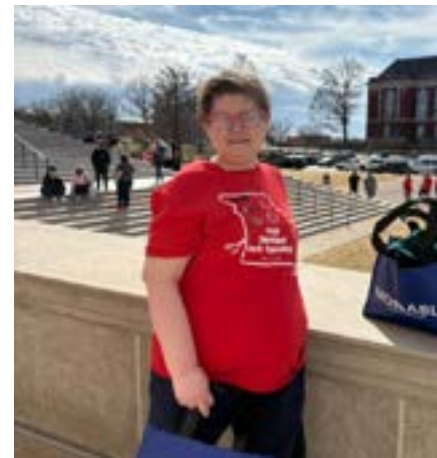

The Arc of the Ozarks has participated in this evaluation, and this marks our eleventh consecutive three-year award since 1994. We are committed to maintaining a standard of excellence that provides the highest quality of service to all clients and families we serve. Our most recent award received is for 2025-2028.

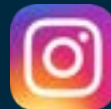
